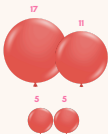


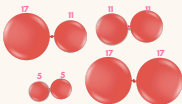
Option 1



Using an electric pump blow up 2 balloons of the same color. Aim for a perfect circle, not a pear shape, by holding the neck of the balloon and pressing it against you while you release some air. Do the same with your 5" balloons.

Tip: Tie two 11" Balloons together. Tie two 17" together. Tie one 17" and one 11" together

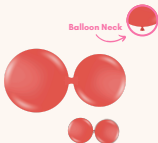
4 Duplet types
SAME COLOR



Tie the two balloons together → at the neck to CREATE a duplet.

Cross the necks into an X shape, pull one neck under the other, tighten well into a knot as close to the base of the neck and pull the balloons apart, so there is plenty of room to stretch between the two balloons.

Balloon Neck



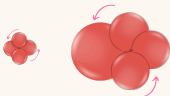
Quad 1

- Two 17" balloons
- Two 11 inch balloons



Quad 2

- One 17" balloon, One 11" balloon
- Two 11 inch balloons



SAME COLOR

← Take two duplets, place one on top of the other at the necks & twist into a quad. Prepare all sets of quads before the next step.

Tip: If you have doubts about this step watch :42 of instructional video.



you should leave out some 11" and 17" duplets to use as filler in the end

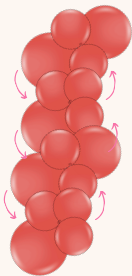
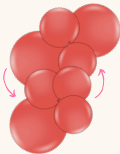


Organize your quads by alternating in the type. This is where you begin to create your own color pattern if you have multiple colors



leave out your extra duplets for the end

Take two quads place one on top of the other, and twist the last balloon of the first quad to the first balloon of the second quad this will create a cluster.



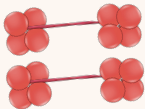
Continue this step with your desired color pattern until you finish your quads.

Hang your garland using the two sticky hooks with the 260 balloons tied. Stick your hook to the desired area use the 260 balloon and loop a balloon through.



Use your extra duplets as filler for any areas you want to add volume. Simply twist your duplet around a balloon by the neck to the area desired.

Tie two 5" quads to each end of one 260 balloon



Loop the 260 around the desired balloon to fill any holes.
